

Bolingbrook teacher Teri Karl asked, "In my Powers of 10 report it talks a lot about how I've



'Twas the night before Christmas, when all through the house



When he left the new minister was very active in the community. Our youth fellowship went to West Virginia to paint a swimming pool to help that community.

When the first racial riots occurred in the north, they were in Rochester in 1963. My minister and I went to FIGHT meetings to support equal pay for equal jobs at

Eastman Kodak. We went in the ghetto for these meetings! Newspapers told stories about whites driving through the ghetto who had windshields broken with bricks, but they always let us pass because we were there to help. Then my sister's roommate married a black man who was becoming a minister at divinity school. We became good friends and I visited him in New Jersey where he practiced.

When it was time for me to choose schools, I wanted to go to the Colorado School of Mines. It was the best geology school in the country, but it was too far away. My second love was to be a minister. My parents went on vacation, and when they returned, I played Peer Gynt suite on the piano and my mother knew I'd made a choice to become a minister.

I went to best Presbyterian College in U.S. and earned a degree in religion. My minister told me not to major in religion. I studied all the major religions. Then I studied at McCormick Theological Seminary in Chicago. That's where I thought all the religions said same thing. I didn't know which religion I wanted to be a minister of, so I walked away, looking for something different.

When I was recognized as minister in Salt Lake City, the strength of that desire surfaced and tears immediately rose from within. I was surprised at how strong the emotions were. I realized being a minister was something I always wanted since I was a kid. It has actually been something I have strived to be as I progressed in School of Metaphysics study. I have given sermons, served through hospice work, created PeaceMakers for the children in all of us, hosted and participated in Cantatas and spiritual theater, and represented SOM at two Parliaments.

On the **Spiritual Ethics** Course

The INVITATION by Dr. Barbara Condron and my heart is the essence of what the Peace Dome symbolizes. I had the opportunity to live in a dome for a while in Colorado, and I thought, "this is whole, rather than square cube". The ideal of SOM is to become a whole, functioning Self, and the dome reflects that wholesomeness.

Since participating in the first cast of The INVITATION influenced my life. I have become kinder, more aware of my influence, and of the influence of nature around me. I love human beings, animals, plants, gasses. It's basically seeing the creator, the divine in all of creation. My ideal image of a minister is one who brings that divine creator to the awareness of the general populace, so they see the divine not only outside but inside themselves.

This is the core of *Spiritual Ethics:* to act from that point of divinity within each of us. Basically, *Spiritual Ethics* is doing the right thing because it is the right thing to do. That is what makes it spiritual. It comes from the Universal Laws and Truths and the divine nature of our being. This speaks to everyone, and serves the Interfaith community.



What advice about ministry do you want to impart to students?

"First thing that comes to mind is the responsibility as a knower is to minister every day to everyone we meet. This is the height of being a teacher. Jesus was a teacher. He taught everywhere he went. A knower teaches what he or she knows.
Teaching teachers,— it's the activity of the School of Metaphysics."

We would like to create our space to welcome our guests to give their attention to a thought of peace as well as lay a peace tile, and draw a Kuan Yin number, just like at the College."

This came from an inspired vision that Angela Appleby, Chicago second cycle student and teacher received during the laying of tiles at the Peace Dome. The interesting link here is that Jay McCormick received a vision for the design of the

"According to the Map of Consciousness, a result of Dr. David


Ideal and purpose help focus and direct our attention and strengthen the image of our desired creations. Labs and events are specific places where we create the opportunity to practice and learn how to apply the metaphysics we are learning and experience creation. Large events like Still Mind, Present Moment, Open Heart are opportunities to stretch ourselves in new and more expansive ways. The Still Mind, Present Moment, Open Heart event held Saturday, September 26th in Des Moines was the largest event hosted since my arrival. It was also one of the most profound workshops I have organized and participated in, rich in learning before, during and after.

We began planning and organizing for the event in March. My first lesson in "Ask and ye shall receive!" occurred as I searched to secure a venue. Since I was new to Des Moines, locating a venue provided me the opportunity to be open and flexible with the possibilities. Though I believed I would get a wonderful venue, something was not working. I must not have been making the request right. In two months I had contacted more than a dozen locations and was unable to secure a location. As I sat teary-eyed in the parking lot of Raccoon River Park, I surrendered and prayed for help from a higher source. The universe responded immediately. My next stop, guided by an inner voice, directed me to the Fred Maytag II Scouting Center where not only was there space available, it was free for not-for-profit organizations. I then realized that a true heart-felt desire free of any attachment to how it manifested was what was missing.



The planning and activities surrounding the event mobilized the whole school around a shared set of Ideals: Increase the awareness of the School of Metaphysics, demonstrate our value as a Beacon of Light for the Community, and raise funds for new soffits and gutters. Every student was engaged in aiding in manifesting our group and individual Ideals. Cathy SImpson helped organize the activities of the overall program, coordinated donations and setup of the venue and created text and graphics for our public outreach. Vivienne Woodson organized our contacts, updated our gmail database, and with the guidance of Mari Hamersley, painted Des Moines with event posters. Vicki Daniel aided in refining the call scripts, assisted in the phone outreach and brochure and poster printing. Donna Cheeseman set the standard for phone calls and business outreach. Donna's contagious enthusiasm and experience with phone outreach generated over 40 leads in the first week and we connected face-to-face with twenty new local business owners. Jesse and Mari led the alumni and media outreach and Jesse coordinated catering and food donations. Our preparation for the event also included a "mini" still mind experience at our class break so the students would have some experience to draw from as they communicated to others the value of the event

My greatest joy was found in teaching and observing the students in applying the metaphysics they were learning and watching as the universal laws continue to work for us. What I Have Learned at the College of Metaphysics And What I Am Grateful For

In the fall of 2010 while walking on South Creek Parkway in Springfield with my friend, Ali, I announced out loud for the first time, "In July of 2013 I am going to the College of Metaphysics and be a student there". I was still in first cycle at the time and I knew I wanted to teach and to live in the school branch before coming to the College. I never doubted or wavered from that decision for even a moment. I never reconsidered or had second thoughts. This was before I knew my dharma is described as *resolve*, or my healing quality is described as *command*, and all the other intuitive reports that have helped me identify my qualities in this life. But as soon as I decided this was me and shared them aloud it was done. I wish I could be as decisive and committed to every decision I ever make as I was to those.

I wanted to come here as a student because all my adult life I had gone to counselors, off and on, to try and fix what was 'wrong' with me. I wanted to overcome the beliefs and thoughts that were holding me back from happiness and satisfaction with myself and life. I believed the College could be the way that was being provided for me to finally learn to change in the ways I need to. As I leave I can say that for the first time in my life I am truly empowered. More than one recent Intuitive Report has affirmed the transformation in my consciousness-physically, mentally, and emotionally.

In July of 2013 I came here to live at the College as a student. I sold almost everything I had collected in the last 40 years so that I wouldn't need to store it. I believed I might be staying for a long time as a grad teacher.

The thing I love the most about living here is the community. Preparing the food, sitting at the table, passing it around between us, in the Language of Mind, is exactly what we do; we nourish and learn from one another. Gathered around the food that we have planted, nurtured, and prepared, talking about our day, laughing, planning, sharing whatever is on our minds, our learning, our questions. Often I feel a rush of emotion – gratitude and affection for this family.

What Dr. Daniel teaches us at table about proper etiquette, is actually mindfullness. He asks us to be aware of why we do what we do. Why do I think it is necessary to spin my plate? If I bend over to lift a bite of food from plate to mouth because I think I might drop it, what else do I lack confidence for? Why do I place my arm around my plate? Who am I suspicious of- who do I think is going to steal my food? Why do I hold my fork that way? I learn to be aware and to ask why- to know myself.

The thing that has been the most difficult, that I have learned the most from, is the community - this family I have adopted. The poet was right, who said, "The same well from which springs your joy, also springs your



sorrow." I have learned from them. I have learned about myself just by being with them every day, day in and day out. There is no escape, just as there is no escape from myself. I learned to see myself in them and because of them; to ask why each one brings up the response I feel toward them. With each encounter I learned about myself.

I learned about my influence. Whatever one person is experiencing affects everyone else; even if I don't speak, my influence is felt. It has given me even more motivation to be still and at peace, to realize that it is for the good of all. I am learning that the best decisions I make for my own growth are also the best decisions for the whole.

I have learned to reason with my emotions. If I can discover the thought that triggered the response I can reason with it. I can even ask what is the belief behind that thought. Very often I find that I have responded to a thought that is not true or to a belief I do not want.

One important thing I learned about teaching by passing on my cheese making to others, is to stay with my student; to stay, watching and observing until I am sure they have a level of competence.

I learned the importance of communication – expressing myself clearly and often. This requires that I am aware of my own desires and feelings. I am still learning these, and maybe I always will be, but now I know the importance of it, and have the ability to evaluate myself in this.

I have learned physical skills, and become stronger and healthier. The world is the schoolroom; physical experiences are the vehicles through which we learn. During the times that I have watched five gallons of milk transform into a wheel of cheese I have learned concentration, intuition, and endurance. Milking Gladys I experienced connecting with an animal spirit in a most intimate way. Skimming milk I witnessed the truth that 'cream rises'; patience the best in me, will rise also when I surrender and wait for it expectantly. Too much of anything calls for creativity; so often too much milk can lead to the happy solution of cheesecake.

Pot Hanging 101: I am grateful for every teacher who encouraged me to stretch my five foot, two inch frame to hang pots on hooks just out of reach. It is a perfect image of going beyond what I had thought at first was not possible. I am very proud every time I stand with both feet on the floor and hang a pot on a hook that is many inches above my head.


I have learned to accept help, by being grateful even though the independence I have built over the years would tell me that I don't need help. I have learned to laugh at myself.

I have learned to ask for forgiveness from others—sometimes more than once in one day; to trust and accept it when it is sincerely given. I have learned to forgive myself.

When you live close to the earth the cycle of birth and death becomes quite familiar. I am grateful for the seasons and for these reminders of the transitory nature of all things physical.

These are some of the things I have learned from living in community with my classmates and teachers. Here I am with others who will love me enough to hold me accountable to myself, and who are on the same journey to higher consciousness and self-understanding that I am. Talking with them about my experiences helps me to get to a place where I can see what my learning needs to be. I am learning from bright souls who will not shrug and say, "Oh well, that's just the way she is", as so many others have done before. For the first time I am living with people who understand what spiritual growth is and who also understand that love is hard work and yet is the most natural, simple thing in all of life. I am learning from souls who love me and who will not let me remain as I am. For this reason I am learning what love really looks like, tastes like, smells like, sounds like, feels like, and is.

People who have not seen me since I came to the College of Metaphysics sometimes do not recognize me. I am different, and I believe the best part of my life is still ahead of me because now I know how to create, that I am creating, that the Creator wants me to be happy, and I have the tools to create with.


December - Chapter 2 The Gospel according to Saint John (Larry Hudson)
