

Slithering dragons made their way past us while less intimidating and smaller ones followed. Fierce swordsmen and beautiful, bejeweled maidens flowed through the streets showing their prideful cultural heritage and sometimes coming very close and even face to face with us. There were many children participating in the parade and dressed to show cultural pride too.

Something that was surprising to me was how palpable the love and joy was and the flow and exchange of beautiful energy between the participants and the onlookers. My perspective was certainly broadened from going to the Parliament of World Religions. Not only was I exposed to cultures and religions from around the world, but I was also exposed to sects right here in the States that I didn't know existed! For instance, Heathenry. I seriously had no idea that even existed. I always thought that it was a slight to refer to someone as a "heathen". I was wrong in this setting. I met a wonderful, self-proclaimed Heathen. We spoke for a bit, and I learned that although I agreed with some of his philosophies and beliefs, not all "fit" for me and that's OK. We're both on sacred paths and can respectfully disagree. The right one is the one that feels true to the individual.

It seems that the noontime highlight for many of us was langar (ritualistic lunch) with the Sikhs outside in huge tents adjacent to the Parliament venue. Langar was free daily with the many Sikhs cooking, serving and cleaning up for us while hundreds of people of all faiths lined up for the food each day. It was delicious and smelled wonderful! I was especially skeptical of a thick, green dish at first, but it turned out to be delicious. It was a mixture of spinach, spices and other ingredients that made it very tasty. They prayed and sang while serving us. We sat on the floor with our shoes off and our heads wrapped. The Sikhs feed all like this every day as part of their belief that no one should go hungry. There's no caste system to this ritualistic luncheon and in any gurdwara (kitchen), they say there might be a doctor sitting on the floor next to a homeless person next to a student, all eating the same food and seated at the same level. All are the same and all are fed!

One can imagine that all the Spiritual energy, fantastic sights and constant sound was a bit overwhelming for many. To counteract the potential overstimulation there were meditation yurts put up downstairs. Thankfully there were four big yurts for anyone to use. I happened upon one that was for everything from meditation to actual napping on thick mats. A nice incense smell was inside with soft, gentle music playing and comfortable spots to sit or lay down scattered along the wall and floor center. It was a lovely and brief reprieve from the busy shows, displays and talks.

Of all the vendors at the Parliament (other than S.O.M. of course), I was most impressed with a group that was started in Taiwan by Buddhist Dharma Master Cheng Yen, the Tzu Chi Foundation whose 2023 theme centers around "the notion of One World" and has been called "Buddhism in action". They are very involved with the United Nations (UN) on multiple levels such as the UN Environment Program (UNEP) and co-chair the UN Interagency Task Force of Religion and Sustainable Development. I didn't even know of this impressive CV at the Parliament but was struck by the practicality of their work and mission. I went home and read more. They weave clothing from recycled plastics via a type of "thread" made from discarded water bottles; they build and distribute pop-up tents for refugees and victims of natural disasters from recycled plastics and furnish them with collapsible tables, chairs and beds also from recycled plastics. How important their work is for the environment and for those people displaced and needing temporary shelter! Also, their work on behalf of water and respect for water and protection of water can't be overlooked. I was captivated! Check them out and read their latest journal at: journal.tzuchi.us.

I listened to many good talks and a few disappointing panels too. I was impressed with the passion that most speakers and panelists had for their topics. I honestly feel that Gino's talk was the best single speaker talk I heard. I hope to share it with others so they can understand what the SOM is and does. Thanks Gino!

I witnessed the Sacred Fire with the Peruvian Shaman and smelled the continuous smell of the smoke and cigars that was integral to this ceremony. I also heard many songs and Universal dances on the patio outside. The people there at Parliament all seemed to be of the same mindset promoting spirituality, freedom, love, diversity and above all, God or Universal Spirit. 



























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Experiences at Parliament



Interview with Dr. Daniel Condron



The **2023** Parliament is now a memory. The 30th anniversary of the **1993** Parliament which itself was a *100th* anniversary of the original Parliament held in Chicago in **1893**, has come and gone from the present moment.

Stay with me here. It is inner Wisdom that allows Mind to unfold the holographic universe and see these connections over time and space. These Parliaments are accessible to anyone through what Nikola Tesla called mental operations. At SOM, this is called simply, "the

exercises". Skill from exercising Mind births something special – Wisdom. When I created my first 10 Most Wanted List, Wisdom was number 1. It remains in the top three 48 years later.

I reflect upon the value of a single lifetime often. It sharpens awareness of how precious TODAY is, and reminds me why I know - sans brain getting in the way - that there is neither love nor reason for wasting one moment.

While the Conscious Mind is limited to the brain, the intelligence is in a kind of 'lock-down'. A description that you probably recognize because it has recently taken a place in humanity's common daydreaming. To see with the Mind's eye what, to the Body's eyes, remains unseen, invites WISDOM. Like heeding communications from your Subconscious Mind in dreams.

Wisdom is more than a memory. I experience

wisdom as a living thought, constantly transforming within my mind to meet a future whose time has yet to come. This seems the purpose people in cultures all over the world pass on 'Wisdom Teachings'. So come with me on a brief inner exploration of mental operations.

During the 1993 PWR, I recall attending the People's Parliament during noon hour each day. There I talked with two of the five founding members who had gathered around a Chicago kitchen table five years earlier to begin dreaming the 1993 Parliament into being. I remember receiving the early communiques from them, mostly through the post office,

describing the gathering as A ONCE IN A LIFETIME EVENT!

It pulled us back in time to the 1893 World's Parliament that began it all. It was the first I had heard of that, and of the Hindu monk who dissolved 10x prejudices with 5 simple words. (See the sidebar about Vivekananda)

Weeks of trains and boats to traverse 8000 miles stretched before him.

The monk had acquired an endorsement from a Harvard professor to address the gathering. With his first five words, Vivekananda received a two-minute standing ovation from the assembly of 7000 people. What were these words that delivered the meaning in his name?

"Sisters and brothers of America!"

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
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
