# National Teachers Meeting

The biannual National Teachers Meeting was held from Friday, October 3rd to Sunday, October 5th at the College of Metaphysics in Windyville, MO. There was a wide range of presenters including many people with their doctorate in metaphysics and others in the Adam series of lessons and in the third cycle of lessons. The weekend started as soon as dinner was over. Dr. Christine Madar gave a series of breakfast, lunch, and dinner lectures on the in-harmony list. She emphasized that change requires effort and we must stay with our students. We must tune into the person we are harmonizing with listening to ourselves and listening to them. Dr. Christine gave a fun example of tuning into others where Dr. Paul Madar and Matt Valois played the piano and the guitar. At first, they were

disharmonious. As they started to listen and tune into each other, they created a harmony between both of them and played beautifully.

"Being a financially secure teacher means you are a secure teacher. It means you know how to negotiate good and honest deals. You know how to ask good questions and you understand and know more after every situation," said Christine Spretnyjak. Christine is an Adam series student and stressed how important choice is. She said, "Your thought of the thing makes the difference. The conscious mind needs to recognize that the I AM is worthy and that abundance is around us all the time." Christine spoke of the importance of being uncomfortable. This is important for change to occur and it is normal when you are receiving more. "My words

will create my abundance or lack thereof. Give attention to your questions and your words," she said. Christine ended her lecture by giving us 3 keys for every choice we make: 1. Always reach for the ideal. Ask for the highest and don't settle. 2. Make sure your words and your thoughts lead to abundance. 3. Make honest deals and communicate them clearly.

Dr. Terri Martin followed Christine and enlightened us on making quantum leaps in our consciousness. She had certain groups of people stand up and demonstrate brain pathways that are built into our culture and limit us from expanding. Groups such as Chicagoans, Texans, Cancers, and Persians stood up to demonstrate the way we think about these groups of people. She then instructed us to write about our mother and father emphasizing certain qualities we saw in them when we were growing up. Identifying the qualities, we saw how they are also a part of us, whether we were transcending and coming to understand them or we still embody them. Dr. Terri said that as we start to recognize our limitations in consciousness and our habitual thought

processes, we can change them and act differently. This is when the quantum

leaps of consciousness happen.

On Saturday morning, Dr. Daniel Condron taught us about changing and upgrading our belief systems. He had us write our most erroneous limiting belief system with our left hand to get out of our brains and into our minds. He said, "Our duty as teachers is to aid people to let go of their belief systems. Think of the limiting beliefs in yourself and root them out." He then took out all the books he had written from the School of Metaphysics and shared his thought process as he was writing the books and after he had completed them. Dr. Daniel put importance on the Holy Works he had translated and how with each one his purpose and assignment in life was being fulfilled. In writing books, he is able to disseminate his knowledge to a

larger group of people and teach them through his words even if he is not physically present.

Golbahar Dadayan, a teacher and student in the third series of lessons, centered her presentation around time. She asked us to ponder the questions, "What is my relationship with time? How well do you direct your time?" Golbahar shared her experience with time and how she overcomes her objections with not having enough time. She told us it is manmade and doesn't really exist. It is all about one's perception. One should always say yes to new opportunities and needs to keep commitments to one's Self.

Dr. Laurel Clark shared her expertise on the different ways the School of Metaphysics can reach out into the community and affect the entire community around them. She said, "There is a need for people to come to an understanding with what happened in Ferguson, Missouri and to visualize or imagine a future of peace and not necessarily the conflict that is occurring right now." She put us into groups and gave us each a scenario of a place we would be able to serve in our community. She asked each group to come up with different ways we may approach these organizations and what services would best serve their needs. The groups of teachers thought of many different service we could offer our communities and Dr. Laurel wrote everything on the board. By the time we were finished, Dr. Laurel was trying to make space for all of the ideas. Dr. Laurel stimulated us to go back to our branches and implement the ideas into our community outreach.

Dr. Sheila Benjamin took us back to the first Parliament of the World's Religions and went through each Parliament since, stating the School of Metaphysics' contributions. She has attended all the Parliaments besides the first and spoke from experience about attending, speaking, and being of service in each one. She also unveiled the next Parliament of the World's Religions which will be in Salt Lake City, Utah next year and the School of Metaphysics will send a delegation. "Will you be a part of the next delegation?" she asked us.

Dr. Barbara Condron finished Saturday night with a lecture on The Next 2400 Years and spoke of the Age of Aquarius and how we are balancing technology, information, and knowledge together to form a new structure for the future. She commented on Dr. Daniel's exercise of having all the teachers stand up and say how many students they were teaching. "We need to start thinking in sixes," she said. Six is a powerful number and is the

number for service and Intuitive, Spiritual Man. The more people we

teach, the more we learn and grow ourselves.



On Sunday morning, Dr. Damian Nordmann led us through the lab positions of the School of Metaphysics. He talked about how our perception of experiences should be, "This is easy," rather than, "This is going to be hard." He outlined each lab position and had teachers from many different school branches come up and share their knowledge in the particular lab position. The outline helped each teacher to know what each lab position was and the responsibilities that go along with it. "It's all about our journey to the top of the mountain. It can be arduous or easy. It all depends on your perception." Dr. Damian had many innovative ideas for the lab positions and gave us all a vision of what a whole functioning school branch could look like.

# Sacred Geometric Forms


In October of the year 2014, a spiritual event was held on the College of Metaphysics Campus. This creation is the planting and implementation of a new sacred geometric form. The platonic solids are listed as the tetrahedron = 4 sides, cube-hexahedron = 6 sides, octahedron = 8 sides, icosahedron = 20 sides, dodecahedron = 12 pentagon shaped sides. On this day we planted a cube. The other four forms have been planted on campus previously on the intersection of lay lines. Their planting was reported by myself in previous editions of Vibrations, the student newsletter of the School of Metaphysics.


Some of the buildings on our campus are square shaped or rectangles so I thought the other forms were more important. One day Dr. Damian said to me, "Dr. Daniel, I think we should plant a cube-hexahedron next so that we will have planted all five geometric forms." Although I was planning to

plant a cube at that moment, I decided the next form planted would be a cube.

I have the ability-gift to walk the land and know perceive sacred sites. Intuitively I know the intersections of these ley lines. One day recently John Crainshaw, a College of Metaphysics graduate, visited the campus. I asked him to go dowse the fields around and behind the Gatehouse on the western part of the campus, with Hezekiah Condron.

After dowsing the area they reported they had found some intersections of ley lines. I then accompanied them to the area. We used metal coat hangers as dousing rods to check the location of these ley lines. We all three agreed on these locations. John had originally showed me how to use coat hangers for dowsing rods.





Immediately the energy from the form lit up and sent golden-white energy down the ley lines increasing their powerful tendency.

Then I led everyone in saying OM NAMA SHIVAYA, then OM MANI PADME HUM, a phrase from the bible. With each of these I saw a different color go from the cube with each of the different chants.

Next, I asked each person present to come forth and touch the newly energized form. Many reported feeling tangible energy. This creation raised the vibration of the College of Metaphysics campus



and thereby, the whole School of Metaphysics. This energy can aid in the quickening of consciousness for students in the School of Metaphysics centered at the headquarters, located at the College of Metaphysics.

#### **Geodesic Form: Cube**

Tad Messenger asked Davi Brown, Brian Hoover, Emily Knox and I to assist in planting the fifth geodesic form on the College of Metaphysics campus. Planting the cube at All Student Weekend September 2014, I permanently grounded a part of myself in the stability of that historical moment. We placed the form at the intersection of two ley lines into a snug square trench. I observed each person reverently shovel dirt into the trench, approach the form, and experience the energy of the installation.

Upon approaching the cube, I expected to feel heat, a tingle, or some obvious sign of the significance of the experience. Standing on the ley line, the moment felt monumental in importance, yet I was disappointed because I did not tangibly notice the energy.

Interestingly enough, during the middle of the ceremony, I did notice I had a few seed ticks on my arm. Calmly, I decided that I would address these bugs later and keep my attention on the present moment. I approached the cube, touched the form, and committed to being in persistent relationship with my Self. No great images came to mind or palpable vibration. Yet something else occurred instead... after being with the form I looked at my arm and a tick had removed its head from my skin and was sauntering towards my fingertips. In this experience, I shifted from believing to knowing that the thought form I was holding in my mind was strong enough to eject the bug and the victim mentality from my reality.



# Becoming a better Leader Through the College Experience by Mavis Renee Curry

When I made my decision to come to the College of Metaphysics I saw it as an opportunity to go deeper into Self, to learn how to be and live a more spiritual life. I had spent most of my life as a business woman. I started at the age of ten selling Christmas cards for the Cheerful Card Company. In the past when I heard the term leadership I would habitually think of an aggressive, go getter interested in a business career.

Charlotte Crabaugh shared my association of leadership with aggressiveness as well as organizations and businesses. She had described her image of a good leader as one who holds the vision for the people they lead. As she pondered this thought she said, "You know, God is the ultimate leader, holding the vision for the entire universe!" This realization changed her opinion of leadership. She now sees it as a desirable quality of the creator. Dr. Daniel describes the universe as a receiving



universe. It is receptivity, the capacity to remain still and receive the whole, that enables the creation of a permanent and lasting vision.

At minimum, we all want to lead productive, prosperous, and peaceful lives. In order to do so we need to be the "captain of our ship" and direct our lives, making choices that result in the attainment of our desires. Whether personal or professional, leadership is a quality that is fundamental to success. A Harvard Business Review article, "What makes a good leader?" by Daniel Goleman, states that "effective leaders are alike in one crucial way: they all have a high degree of emotional intelligence." The article goes on to define the five components of emotional intelligence as: self-awareness, self-regulation,

motivation, empathy, and social skill. It concludes that emotional intelligence can be learned, "but not with traditional programs that target the rational part of the brain. Extended practice, feedback from colleagues, and your own enthusiasm for making the change are essential to becoming an effective leader." The College of Metaphysics is just the place to practice leadership in unique ways and get feedback from divine friends. The added bonus is the immersion in nature in a course of study that is developing all the qualities that make for a whole functioning Self, mentally, emotionally and physically.

Silvia Galvan sees a leader as someone who keeps the whole in mind when making decisions, knows how to ask questions, and leads by example. "At the College of Metaphysics I am able to choose what I lead and take the initiative to define exactly how I lead." The school offers many unique opportunities to lead. Silvia is learning to make cheese, care for the earth ship and it's inhabitants, and direct and care for the thousands of Intuitive Report requests that headquarters receives each year. These are all areas new to Silvia that challenge her leadership skills in new and unique ways.

Another opportunity to expand leadership skills is to teach others how to lead. Tad teaches the college students through is words and action that, as we work with the animals, it is important to be still and receive directly from the animals what it is they need. Larry was observant and receptive to the milk cows he works with and quickly recognized the need for leadership. A strong lead cow makes life easier for the herd and the barnyard animals who have to scamper for cover when the cows are unruly, which happens when three cows try to take the lead. Shirley, who should be the lead cow tends to be stubborn and bossy, head-butting the other cows. "I believe the reason Shirley is bossy with the other cows is because she gets frustrated when the other cows pass her up on the way to the barn. I believe with a little support and encouragement she can become the leader she desires to be.

That will help her let go of being stubborn and bossy." I can certainly recall bosses who shared Shirley's leadership style!

Every day decisions are made in the garden. When to spray, what to pick, what to plant, etc. Dr. Daniel teaches every morning how to care for the garden and hold our attention where it needs to be. including knowing where our feet are. Doug demonstrates his leadership skills keeping us focused when Dr. Daniel is unavailable, maintaining a constant eye on what is happening in the garden. "Leadership describes a person's ability to set a model example while directing others in the pursuit of a goal," says Doug. While charisma is often mentioned in documents of leadership, the ability to delegate Doug believes is the most valuable. "Effective delegation requires good communication, which means the leader confirms that the other has heard and understands what has been offered. An ideal leader leverages herself through delegation to multiply her influence thereby expanding not only her influence but that of the group as well. When a leader is generous in these ways. the group prospers." And so does the garden. Most of what we eat



at the college comes from what we grow with our attention and love. Doug holds a vision for a productive and beautiful garden which also includes the addition of canna lilies framing the front of the upper garden.



As Charlotte recognized, the quality of leadership includes the capacity to hold the vision for others to follow. We enhance our capacity to hold the vision through our visualization exercises that begin in the first cycle and continue to grow in scope and depth as we progress through our studies. At the college, we practice visualization constantly, from Larry visualizing how the cows will progress to and from the barn each day, to Charlotte teaching and visualizing the progress on cheese creation, to Doug visualizing the abundance of produce resultant from a well cared for garden, free from predators like bugs, chickens or deer.

Every month we practice expanding the scope of our visualization skills on a larger scale as individuals from the branches join us at headquarters for third weekend, spiritual focus sessions, to special events like all student weekends and the 40th anniversary. Karen visualizes the perfect meal plan which includes what and how the food will be prepared, teaching and offering us new ways to lead others and to be flexible to the changes that can and do occur, especially on large weekends. On these weekends I get the opportunity to lead karma yoga,

organizing and directing college students who in turn lead branch students on the love and care of our campus. On all student weekends, branch students, directors and other school leaders have the opportunity to plan and visualize the activities and opportunities to lead and learn in new and creative ways.

The greatest vision we all hold is the development of a whole functioning Self and a whole functioning school. 

## WHO IS MALALA and Why **Does She Matter to YOU?**

Two years ago, October 9, Malala boarded her

northwest Pakistani district of Swat. A gunman asked for her by name, then pointed a pistol at her and fired three shots. One bullet hit the left side of her forehead, travelled under her skin through the length of her face, and then went into her shoulder. She was flown to England and her miraculous recovery is a story worth hearing.

Last year, July 12th, her 16th birthday, Malala led the first "youth takeover" of the UN and spoke to an audience of 500 young advocates calling for worldwide access to education. "The terrorists thought they would change my aims and stop my ambitions, but nothing changed in my life except this: weakness, fear and hopelessness died. Strength, power and courage was born ... I am not against anyone, neither am I here to speak in terms of personal revenge against the Taliban or any other terrorist group. I'm here to speak up for the right of education for every child. I want education for the sons and daughters of the Taliban and all terrorists and extremists." She was nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize which went to the Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons.

This year, at 17, Malala Yousafzai is the youngest recipient of the NOBEL PEACE PRIZE to date.

I first heard the news through an email Larry Hudson, SOM Treasurer, sent to me. Immediately, I sent the email at right to the cast of THE INVITATION - current and past members. Please read on!

#### email October 10, 2014....

Sending this out to all of you who bring THE INVITATION to life. Perhaps how we fuel the A-Field is helping to shape our destinies. Debbie and Joe and Diana .... Obviously, THE **INVITATION** in St. Louis at an African American College Prep school - young people who are Malala's age! - is heaven sent. The universe IS scripting this amazing time for SOM!
